**PAUL Bullock, P.Ag.** is a well known Professor and researcher in the Soil Science Department at the University of Manitoba. Paul is well qualified to share his expertise and experience gained from working in industry and as a well-known researcher. He will help the audience understand primary and secondary impacts on crop production and how well prepared we may be to identify gaps and cope with change.

**DOUG Wilcox, P.Ag.** is responsible for crop insurance program development and agronomy related research for Manitoba Agricultural Services Corporation (MASC) based out of Portage La Prairie. Doug has helped make MASC a leader in using crop insurance information for outreach purposes. For over 20 years he has been analyzing and publishing relevant analysis of the crop insurance data for agronomy outreach and benchmarking purposes – including trying to establish if climate change is impacting crops in Manitoba.



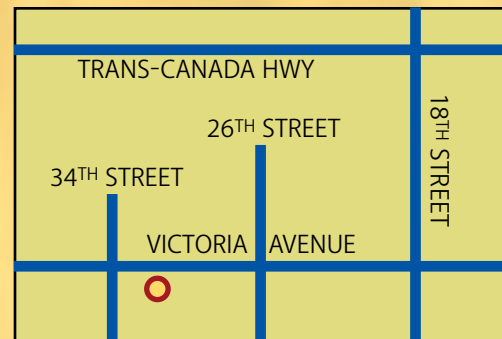
